- Charles Darwin (British naturalist)
 - On the Origin of Species (1859)
 - Species evolve through a process of natural selection





- Social Darwinism
 - Herbert Spencer (British philosopher)
 - Society also developed through 'survival of the fittest'
 - Used to justify imperialism (stronger nations should dominate weaker ones)


